Elisabeth (Liz) Quinn joined the Navy in 2001 as a Maritime Warfare Officer, serving on various ships before transitioning to Intelligence in 2010. She then held multiple Intelligence Officer roles at sea and ashore, deploying three times to the Middle East in both Navy and Joint capacities.

Her operational experience also includes deployments across Australia for Border Protection operations and to the Solomon Islands as part of Operation ANODE. Additionally, she participated in numerous multi- and bilateral exercises throughout Southeast Asia and the United States.

Beyond her military career, Liz has an extensive background in team sports at all levels, having built and led teams throughout her professional journey. She spearheaded the Richmond Football Club's AFLW Culture and Leadership program for its first five seasons and is a graduate of the BHP AFL Women's Coaching Academy—a 12-month program designed to accelerate the development of emerging coaches. As part of this program, she also completed the National AFL Level 3 Coaching Accreditation Course.

In 2023, Liz founded Clutch Leadership, an organisation dedicated to helping teams and businesses optimise their performance through leadership and culture development. In addition to her work with Richmond, she has worked with elite state and national-level athletes, the AFL, Tennis Australia, and the Collingwood Magpies Super Netball team. She also serves as the Human Performance Coach for Prokick Australia, an athletic program that places punters into U.S. college football programs. Her expertise extends to leadership and culture programs for organisations such as Coles, AG Coombs, and Anywise.

Passionate about veterans' issues, Liz has been actively involved in veteran support initiatives since 2015. She believes strongly in fostering identity and community beyond the Defence sphere to assist individuals in transitioning to civilian life.
